SUMMARY

I conduct research in the field of digital innovation, analyzing gender, socioeconomic and public policies implications, specialising in the expansion of the **platform economy** and **artificial intelligence**.

Since 2013, I have been **faculty affiliated at the Berkman Klein Center for Internet and Society (Harvard University)**. I am member of COSMOS – The Centre on Social Movement Studies, Faculty of Political and Social Sciences at the Scuola Normale Superiore in Florence.

I am the **Chair of a COST Action** on intersectional feminist perspective to platform work (P-WILL) paneuropean network, with 300 members of 40 countries.

I am the **leading scientist of the research group Dimmons** (recognized by the Catalan government 2021 SGR 01383). I am accredited since 2021 as a **full professor** by Catalan Agency for Management of University and Research Grants (AGAUR).

I have extensive experience leading competitive research (a total of 31 projects since my PhD defence). In total, I have won **23 highly competitive calls**: I have been the principal investigator of partner members of **seven European projects of H2020 and international calls**, eight competitive Spanish and Catalan research projects, and nine major contracts with the administration. I am the founder director of the Barcelona UOC Chair on Digital Economy, a joint effort between UOC, Barcelona City Council and Barcelona Activa (Public Enterprise). I have been on the advisory board of three other European projects and an ERC Project. Over my career, I fundraised a means of almost **380,508.8€ per year**. **Total jobs created** by the projects I have directed include **ten postdocs** (of 2 to 3 years), **eight predocs** (4 years) and 20 research assistants (diverse durations). I was selected for the **Step 2 interview of the ERC Consolidator 2021 and 2022 calls** on a project on "Gender equality and platform economy".

I have published **47 peer-reviewed top impact articles** in Journals (including Q1 such as *Nature*, *Social Movement Studies*, *CoDesign*, *Journal Information*, *Communication and Society*, and *PLOS ONE*), and three articles at the most prestigious peer-reviewed repository in Computer Science (ACM), and in editorials (including peer-reviewed editorials such as Routledge, Oxford University Press, and IGI Global). I am also the author of eleven books and six e-books. I have presented at the ECPR, at The National Bureau of Economic Research, Opensym, and Internet, Politics, & Policy (Oxford).

I have supervised three postdocs, **supervising thirteen PhD theses** (five defended), and two Master theses at UAB and UOC.

I was a finalist in the first round of the 2013 **Elinor Ostrom (Economic Nobel Prize 2009) Award** for Young Scholars in the field of commons theory.

Previously, I was **Ramon y Cajal** postdoc and tenure researcher at IN3 UOC, a **Juan de la Cierva** postdoc at the IGOP UAB, and **Marie Skłodowska-Curie/Beatriu de Pinós** postdoc at the Berkman Klein Centre (Harvard), a one year fellow at the Real Colegio Complutense (Harvard) and visiting scholar at **MIT**. I obtained my PhD in Social and Political Sciences at the **European University Institute** (EUI) in 2010 and was a visiting research scholar at **Berkeley University** and **Stanford University** in 2008. I hold a Graduate **Degree in Economics** (University of Valencia) and in Social and Cultural **Anthropology** (U. Rovira i Virgili).

My investigation has informed technological development adopted by the **APACHE Foundation** and **Google**. My work has informed the **European Agenda of Collaborative Economy** of the European Commission 2016, and I have been advising the **Amsterdam, NYC and Barcelona City Councils**, and the **European and Catalan Parliaments**. I appear frequently in the media.

These make me familiar with a platform entrepreneurship and designer perspective, and policymaking perspective.
